The Lady Harmsworth Blunt Memorial Trophy - Nations Cup –

Horses start for the nation where they are registered by the closing date of entry (14th August 2009). The Nations Cup will be awarded to the nation whose entries score the highest number of points according to the following scale:

First place of a class	5 points
Second place of a class	4 points
Third place of a class	3 points
Fourth place of a class	2 points
for the remaining places	1 point
Gold Medal-Champion (junior, senior)	6 points
Silver Medal Winner (Reserve Champion) (junior, senior)	5 points
Bronze Medal Winner (junior, senior)	4 points

Only the best result of every class for each participating nation will be noted.

To determine the winning nation and the following positions the best five results for the classes plus the results from the championships of each country qualify.

All Nations Cup - Breeders' Trophy - The Ian Hedley Memorial Trophy -

This is a perpetual trophy donated by The Hon. Mrs. Mary Ann Wragg and Mrs. Annette Hedley, created in cooperation with the very well-known artist Mrs. Karen Kasper, USA.

The Hon. Mrs. Wragg and Mrs. Hedley, had the idea to honour not only the owners, but especially the breeders of the most successful horses. They would like to see recognition given to the country, which has bred the most prizewinners each year on the occasion of the Nations Cup show.

Points will be awarded to the horses as in the Nations Cup competition (see above scale) but will be given to the country of origin (registration at birth).

Conditions of entry

All Purebred Arabians, who are in possession of an equine-passport are entitled to participate. Further they have to be registered in a WAHO accepted studbook at the closing date of entries. Horses entered have to be qualified for the participation.

Qualifications of entry

Horses should have qualified at an ECAHO affiliated show in one of the following ways:

- a 1st to 3rd place in an A or B show or
- a 1st to 3rd place in a National Championship Show or
- Gold Medal Champion- or Silver Medal Winner or 1st place of the yearlings on the occasion of a C-Show.

Horses born or registered outside ECAHO-Member-Countries must either qualify in an EAHSC affiliated show, or may qualify at other shows accepted by EAHSC such as:

- a title of Champion or Reserve Champion or "TOP TEN" at the US-Nationals or
- Champion- or Reserve-Champion-Title or a 1st place at the Scottsdale Competitions or

- Champion- or Reserve-Champion-Title on the occasion of all US "regional" competitions or
- Champion- or Reserve-Champion-Title or 1st to 3rd place on the occasion of an official National Championship.

Proof of qualification must be enclosed with the entry form and will be checked by the EAHSC.

Preliminary Classes

1) fillies, yearlings	(born 2009)
2) colts, yearlings	(born 2009)
3) fillies, 2 years old	(born 2008)
4) colts, 2 years old	(born 2008)
5) fillies, 3 years old	(born 2007)
6) colts, 3 years old	(born 2007)
7) mares, 4 - 6 years old	(born 2006-2004)
8) mares, 7 – 10 years old	(born 2003-2000)
9) mares, 11 years and older	(born 1999 and before)
10) stallions, 4 – 6 years old	(born 2006-2004)
11) stallions, 7 – 10 years old	(born 2003-2000)
12) stallions, 11 years and older	(born 1999 and before)

The age group will be fixed according to the 1st January of the year of birth.

Classes with more than 16 horses will be divided. Classes with less than 3 horses will be combined with the next age group of the same sex.

Method of judging the classes

Five judges judge each class independently from one another and without catalogue according to the following criteria:

- a) type
- b) head and neck
- c) body and topline
- d) legs
- e) movement

Based on the 20-points-system with half points. The points awarded by the judges will be added and divided by the number of judges.

Rule for ties

The higher place will be given to the horse with the most points for type. If there is still a tie, the higher place will be given to the horse with the most points in movement. Failing a decision on either of these, one judge chosen by ballot will name his preference. (This applies to the places 1-10 of each class.)

Championships

Championships are not given according to the results achieved in the preceding classes. All Championships will be judged independently and comparatively.

The following Championships will be awarded:

Junior Female Championship	(classes 1, 3, 5)
Junior Male Championship	(classes 2, 4, 6)
Senior Female Championship	(classes 7, 8, 9)
Senior Male Championship	(classes 10, 11, 12)

All Champions (Goldmedalwinners) and Reserve-Champions (Silvermedalwinners) will be doping tested. In case the result is positive, costs have to be carried by the owner of the horse.

Methods and rules of judging Championships

Championships will be judged comparatively as follows:

The first- and second-placed horses of each class will qualify for the Championships.

First-placed horses will line up in the front row in order of age (youngest on the right) with second-placed horses to line up behind them in the same order in the second row.

Judges will examine all horses individually trotting, and then on standing. The judges must not confer.

The champion Gold medal winner is selected from the horses in the front rank by individual written votes from each judge. The best placed horse will be champion Gold medal winner. In the event of a tie, the horse that received the highest number of points in its class will be declared champion Gold medal winner.

When the champion Gold medal winner has been selected the Silver medal winner (reserve) will be selected in the same way from all other first and second placed horses that have qualified for the championships.

The Bronze medal winner will be selected using the same system used to select the Silver medallist.

A horse nominated by a judge for Gold Medal will obtain 4 points; for the Silver Medal 2 points and for the Bronze Medal 1 point. In the event of a tie, the horse that received the highest number of points in its class will be declared Champion Gold medal winner. In the event of a further tie, the "Rules for Ties in Qualifying Places" will apply.

The votes of the judges in the Championships will be announced and will be published at the show office immediately after the judging has finished.

A fourth horse will be selected, which will become the Bronze medal winner should one of the three medal winners be disqualified. In case the 4th placed horse is not clear to see due to the judges notes, the judges will be asked to nominate a horse. This fourth placed champion will not be announced officially. In the event that two or more of the medal winners are disqualified, no further substitution will be made, apart from the third placed champion moving up to be champion.

For the prize giving ceremony the reserve champion will be announced and honored first, finally followed by the champion. The judges' votes will be published at the show office immediately after the judging has finished.

In the event of a horse placed first in its class being unable to take part in the championships, the horse placed second in the class will move forward and be judged with the other horses placed first. Should a horse placed first be sent out of the ring by the judges for any reason it will be deemed to have taken part in the championships and, therefore, the second placed horse will not be judged with the other first placed horses. Substitutions for absent first-placed or second-placed horses by third-placed or lower-ranked horses will not be permitted.

All horses that qualify for their respective championships must take part in the championships.

Unless a certificate from the CD veterinarian is produced, failure to compete will disqualify the horse from the show, with its record of score and class placing being deleted and the horse being disqualified from showing for the period of one year as from the date of the show. In the event of a disqualification, horses placed behind the disqualified horse will move up a place in the class but are not entitled to enter the championships.

Regulations

1. The Rules of the Blue Book 2010 of the European Arab Horse Show Commission (EAHSC) fully apply to the complete event. In case of doubt or disagreement the original English version is becoming effective.

Apart from that following regulations are effective:

- Rules for Conduct of Shows
- Rules for Ties in Qualifying Places
- Rules for Championships
- Rules for Disciplinary Committees
- Rules for Medication Control
- IV Addendum

Participants submit themselves to the judges' decisions which are limited to that particular show event and based on the classification system fixed in the schedule. The judges have been invited by the promoter, they work honorary and are not representatives of the societies they belong to.

2. All horses must be free from infections and from a home stock free of epidemic diseases. They must be effectively vaccinated against INFLUENZA. **The Vaccination Certificate has to be presented! A copy of the Vaccination Certificate and the registration certificate/equinepassport with graphic description has to be sent together with the entry form to the show organizer and must be presented at the showground for identification.**

According to the DC veterinarian's decision any horse may be quarantined.

3. No compensation for the transportation costs can be granted.
4. Reservation of box stables have to be made together with the entry and can only be considered if **the stable-fee of EUR 178,50 has been paid.**
5. The promoters are neither liable for damages and accidents to participants, grooms, audience or fittings, nor for theft.
6. The **entry fee is EUR 100,00 per horse** in all competitions. The fees have to be paid **in advance by the exhibitor**; otherwise the promoters can exclude horses from the show.

Should the promoter accept entries or changes after the closing date, the double entry fee has to be paid in advance.

7. The handlers are asked to wear proper and tidy clothes. They are allowed to wear any costume normally worn in their country of origin but without any advertising on it. The horses have to be presented in leather bridles or light halters. Stallions and colts aged three years and over must be shown wearing suitable bridles with bits.
8. **Only one handler per exhibit is permitted in the ring at any one time**
9. Stable equipment has to be provided by the exhibitors.
10. All Champions and Reserve Champions will be dope tested. Any other horse may be dope tested on request of the DCs. In case the result is positive, costs have to be carried by the owner of the horse. All exhibitors will be expected to conduct themselves in the spirit of the rules of ethical show behavior and will be held responsible for themselves and their handlers. Decisions of the show committee, the judges, the disciplinary committee and the stewards are final. They shall not be liable for any consequence of any decision they may make.
11. **Exhibit numbers**, which are to be returned can be obtained from the show office **against deposit of EUR 20,00. No deposit return for damaged exhibit numbers.**
12. **Importation of overseas horses:**
It is suggested that exhibitors contact their own travel agents, for example traveling with Carnet ATA.
13. **Only accredited photographers are allowed to be in the ring. Please contact the VZAP-office in Hanover regarding any accreditation.**
14. **Video- and sound-recording are only allowed for private use. Sale and publications of video-records (e.g. via internet) or other digital possibilities are not allowed and will be prosecuted.**

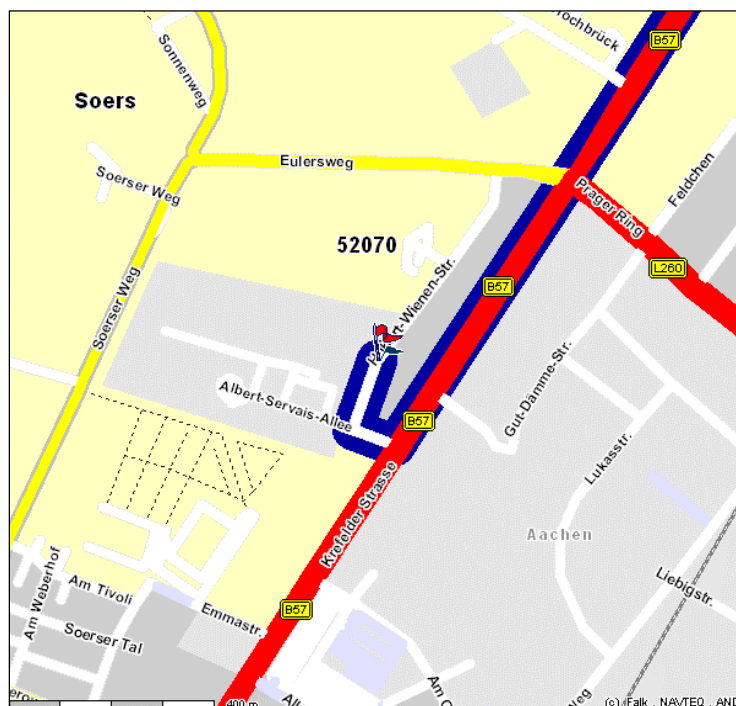
Route:

At the interchange "Aachener Kreuz" you have to follow the signposting in the direction "Antwerpen". Afterwards you have to leave at the exit "Aachen-Zentrum/Würselen". Rules for Conduct of Shows - European Arab Horse Show Commission - Blue Book 2010

1. By participating at a show, show organisers, judges, exhibitors, owners and handlers agree that they will unconditionally submit themselves and the persons accompanying them to the "Rules for Conduct of Shows" and, as regards veterinary matters and drug misuse, to the relevant FEI Veterinary Regulations. The accompanying persons include e.g. trainers or persons representing the show organizer as well as assistants of any of those persons. They will accept the jurisdiction of the Disciplinary Committee (DC), the Standing Disciplinary Committee (SDC) and the ECAHO Appeals Committee (EAC). Show organisers are not permitted to introduce rules which are in conflict with the EAHSC "Rules for Conduct of Shows". The person who has signed the entry form will be considered to be the person responsible for the horse in question. These Rules will be interpreted when necessary under the provisions of the laws of Switzerland.
2. Horses must be accompanied at the show by a horse passport containing all vaccination records. Those horses coming from a country that does not issue a passport, must be accompanied by an official Registration document which includes a graphic description and all vaccination records.

The show organizer

3. The show organizer reserves the right to refuse an entry, but must give the reason for refusal in writing.
4. The show organizer will issue a printed show catalogue. The name of every horse has to be printed in the show catalogue, as well as the names of sire and dam, (and maternal grandsire if possible) date of birth, colour, the names of the breeder and the owner. Should a horse's name not be mentioned in the catalogue, its participation at the show will be allowed only if the exhibitor cannot not be blamed for the omission; it will be for the DC to decide.
The show catalogue shall furthermore contain:
 - The Rules for Conduct of Shows,
 - The judging system used, the rules for ties and the rules for championships
 - For Shows outside Europe (as defined by the Constitution of ECAHO, Art. 3.2) where prize money is allowed, the total amount and distribution of prize money.
5. No class may be split unless there are more than 16 horses entered. Combination of a class with the next age group of the same sex is permitted if the number of entries for the class is below three.
6. a) No announcement indicating the identity, breeding or past performance of exhibits, or the identity of their owners will be made during judging. It is, however, permissible for this information to be given out after the judges score sheets have been collected for each exhibit. b) Show organisers will not release details of competitors or their exhibits to the press at any time prior to the catalogue being put on sale at the showground. Catalogues will not be offered for sale, published or posted on internet more than one day before the commencement of the show.
7. No member of the show organising team may judge.
8. The show organizers will ensure a proper rotation of judges.
9. The show organizer will provide appropriate transport, accommodation and meals during the show, for the judges, DC members, ring master and any other ECAHO show officials. If a judge, DC member or ring master cancels the invitation after the travel arrangements have been made, he will pay all the costs arising out of this booking.
10. No gifts in the form of fees or money are allowed to be paid or given by the organiser, nor accepted by the judges, DC members and ring masters. Material gifts are allowed.

Judges

11. EAHSC listed judges and judges invited to judge at ECAHO affiliated shows agree to judge with integrity and honesty and to carry out their judging duties solely with the objects of ECAHO and the welfare of the horses in mind.
12. Judges will not consult the show catalogue before or during the show at which they are judging.
13. a) Judges appointed at a show will not knowingly judge horses concerning which there may be an actual or apparent conflict of interest. No judge appointed at the show may exhibit, ride, drive or handle an entered horse.
b) Exhibitors will declare on the entry form any actual or apparent conflict or interest with any of the judges invited for the show. Any exhibitor not declaring an existing conflict of interest will forfeit all entry fees and will be prevented from showing the horse.
c) Organisers will not accept any entries for which any actual or apparent conflict of interest with one of the appointed judges has been indicated, unless a reserve judge is available.
14. An actual or apparent conflict of interest may occur if a horse is judged that:
 - has been bought or sold by the judge either as owner or agent,
 - is owned in whole or part by the judge or by a member of the judge's family, or
 - business partner in an Arab horse business venture,
 - has been leased by the judge, at any time
 - has been bred by the judge or is the property of a breeding organization in
 - which the judge is or was an employee,
 - has been regularly trained, examined or treated by the judge in a professional capacity,
 - is the subject of an on-going negotiation to buy or lease, or a provisional purchase condition to which the judge is a party.In case of doubt, the DC's decision will prevail.
15. In the show ring, all communication between judges and handlers prior to the presentation of prizes will be through the ring master.
16. Judges may withhold any award if in their opinion the exhibit does not merit such an award.
17. Spare

Conduct of Halter Classes

18. All handlers at A and Title Shows must be in possession of a valid handlers permit in order to participate.
19. Handlers will be neatly dressed. They may wear any costume normally worn in their country of origin. Handlers will not wear clothes carrying any form of advertising which discloses the connection of the horse they are handling.
20. The judge(s) may request that the ringmaster order unruly horses to be withdrawn.
21. The judge(s) may request that the ringmaster ask a handler to open a horse's mouth or pick up its feet for inspection.
22. Exhibits are to be judged standing, walking and trotting. Handlers who do not comply with the ring master's instructions regarding the above may be given a Yellow/Red card by the ring master. The judges may request that the ring master show a handler a yellow or red card.
23. a) Horses will appear in the collecting ring no less than 10 minutes before the start of the class.

- b) Exhibits that appear late (missing the walk around the ring) will be excluded from the class.
24. Stallions and colts aged three years and over must be shown wearing bridles and bits that are both secure and comfortable for the horse. All bridles without bits are equally to be both secure and comfortable for the horse.
25. a) Any horse becoming loose in the collecting ring is subject to a penalty at the discretion of the DC.
b) Any horse becoming loose in the show ring will immediately continue to be shown. Should the horse become loose a second time it will be disqualified.

26. spare

Soundness

27. Exhibits that appear to be lame may be assessed and placed by the judges. Judges may exclude any horse so lame that assessment will inflict pain.

28. spare

Disguising of Exhibits

29. No alteration of the basic colour of the skin, coat or hooves is permitted. Hoof paints, colourless varnishes, coat dyes, glitter spray and cosmetic operations including skin grafts are forbidden. Colourless hoof oils, Vaseline or oil and white chalk used on white legs may be accepted.
30. Artificial methods of dilating the eyes or affecting the natural action of the horse or otherwise influencing its action or behaviour by oxygenating the bloodstream or by the use of weights or artificially weighted shoes, or by electrical or chemical treatment of any kind at any time before or during exhibition are forbidden. Burns, cuts or other marks on the body of any exhibit in such places or positions as to indicate that prohibited methods have been used will be regarded as full and adequate grounds for exclusion of any exhibit from competition, at the discretion of the DC with veterinary advice.
31. a) In halter classes horses may be fully or partly body-clipped, subject to eyelashes being left uncut, hair inside the ears left unshaved and tactile hair left intact around the nose, muzzle and the eyes. Removing the hair around the eyes by shaving or any other means and the artificial colouring of the skin in that area is not permitted. Horses not fulfilling these criteria will not be allowed to participate.
b) No equipment intended to alter the natural appearance of the horse is permitted in the stables, including necksweats, neck collars, tailracks, hobbles or weights. Anyone using such equipment on the showground may be suspended by the DC for the period of the show.

32. spare

Cruelty

33. Excessive whipping or shanking, excessive stimulation by noise or intimidation, excessive circling of the horse, use of electric shock devices or infliction of pain by any means is forbidden in all parts of the showground or stable areas, at all times.
34. The above offences are punishable by issue of a Yellow/Red card.

Enforcement

35. **Verbal warnings:** DC members, ringmasters, stewards or show officials may issue verbal warnings. These are not recorded in the DC report.
36. **Yellow an red cards** may be issued by DCs in the collecting ring and the main ring. They are issued to a handler and are a visible and public warning of an offence having been committed. The date and offence will be recorded by the DC on the handlers licence and in the DC report and it will be made public by announcement at the show and on the ECAHO website.
37. **A yellow Card** may be issued if there is a further offence after a warning or it may be issued without such warning.
38. **A red Card** will be issued if the handler receives a second yellow card for having committed a further handling offence during the same show. The offender will then be banned from handling any horses for the rest of the show in which he receives the red card. The horse being shown by a handler when he receives a red card may be shown by another handler at the end of the class. In the event of a serious offence involving mistreatment or dangerous behaviour, DCs may issue a red card without prior warning.
39. Any handler disobeying the instructions of any DC member, judge, ring master or other official may be punished immediately by being shown a yellow or red card.

Veterinary Matters

40. Horses with apparent clinical signs of a disease may not participate at the show at the discretion of the DC Veterinarian. If the DC Veterinarian diagnoses apparent clinical signs of a contagious disease, the horse must be immediately put into quarantine and may not participate at the show.
41. Vaccination regulations for shows will require 12 months intervals normally, or shorter where local/national authorities mandate it. Such shorter intervals to be shown on the entry form (see Addendum – Equine Influenza Vaccination page 35).
42. All Veterinary treatment necessary at the show ground must be carried out according to FEI Veterinary regulations. The person responsible for the horse will ask the vet who treats the horse to complete a treatment form and present it to the DC-vet at the show.
43. a) The administration of any substance not a normal nutrient (including irritants applied to the skin or mucous membranes or mydriatic drugs in the eyes), whether intentionally or unintentionally which may affect the performance, temperament or soundness of an exhibit is forbidden.
b) The DC may order chemical tests on any exhibit.
c) Judges may request the DC to test any horse.
(See the section on "Medication Control" page 25).

Complaints

44. A show organizer, appointed judge, ring master, exhibitor, owner or handler of a horse entered at the show may lodge a complaint alleging infringement of the rules of the EAHSC, contained in the "Blue Book". A complaint concerning a horse or handler is to be made in writing within 1 hour of the alleged infringement occurring. Any other complaint, except concerning a complaint about a judge or any other official including show organisers, is to be made in writing before the end of the show. A deposit of € 200,- or equivalent in local currency will be lodged with the DC and may be retained if the complaint is considered frivolous, at the DC's discretion. Such forfeiture belongs to ECAHO.
45. Any complaint about a judge or any other official including the show organisers is to be made in writing and signed by two individuals. Such complaint must contain any evidence and be sent to the ECAHO executive Secretary (show section) within 3 days of the show. A deposit of € 300 must be paid in accordance with the instructions and deadline given by the Executive Secretary (show section). The procedure will be conducted in accordance with the Rules for Disciplinary Committees, articles 19 et seq.

European Arab Horse Show Commission Blue Book 2010 Rules for Ties and Championships and Medication Controls

Rules for Ties in Qualifying Places

In the event of a tie in the qualifying places of a class, the higher place will be given to the horse with the most points for type. If there is still a tie, the higher place will be given to the horse with the most points for movement. Failing a decision on either of these, one judge chosen by ballot will name his preference.

Rules for Championships

1. With the exception of shows judged under the single judge system, Championships will be judged as follows:
 - a) The horses placed first in their class line up ordered according to age. The horses placed second in their class line up behind them in the same order.
 - b) The first placed horses will be judged individually, standing and trotting.
 - c) The judges will not discuss the horses.
 - d) The Champion Gold medal winner is selected from amongst the horses placed first in their class by individual written votes from each judge. The best placed horse will be Champion Gold medal winner.
2. The Silver medal winner will be chosen according to the following system which must be clearly stated in the schedule:

The Silver medal winner will be selected in the same way as the Gold medalist from all other horses that have qualified for the Championship.
3. The Bronze medal winner will be selected using the same system used to select the Silver medalist.
4. A horse nominated by a judge for Gold Medal will obtain 4 points; for the Silver Medal 2 points and for the Bronze Medal 1 point. In the event of a tie, the horse that received the highest number of points in its class will be declared Champion Gold medal winner. In the event of a further tie, the "Rules for Ties in Qualifying Places" will apply.
5. The votes of the judges in the Championships will be announced and will be published at the show office immediately after the judging has finished.
6. A fourth horse will be selected, which will become the Bronze medal winner should one of the three medal winners be disqualified. If this exhibit is not apparent from the voting papers, the judges will be asked to nominate one. This horse will not be announced. In the event that two or more of the medal winners are disqualified, no further substitution will be made.
7. If a horse placed first in its class is not able to take part in the Championship, the horse placed second in the class will move forward and be judged with the other horses placed first. Should a horse placed first be sent out of the ring by the judges for any reason, it will be deemed to have taken part in the championship and, therefore, the second placed horse will not be judged with the other first placed horses. Substitutions for absent first-placed or second-placed horses by third-placed or lower-ranked horses will not be permitted.
6. All horses that qualify for their respective Championships must take part in the Championship. Unless a certificate from the DC veterinarian is produced, failure to compete will disqualify the horse from the show, with its record of score and class placing being deleted and the horse being disqualified from showing for the period of one year as from the date of the show. In the event of a disqualification, horses placed behind the disqualified horse will move up a place in the class but not be entitled to enter the Championship.

Rules for Medication Control.

1. Unless otherwise stated in the Rules for medication control, any procedure related with drug misuse follow the FEI Veterinary Regulations.
2. The administration of any substance not a normal nutrient (including irritants applied to the skin and mucous membranes), whether intentionally or unintentionally, which may effect the performance, temperament or soundness of an exhibit is forbidden. Such forbidden substances are listed by the presently applicable FEI Veterinary Regulations.
3. a) At all Title Shows and A-shows the medication testing of all four champions is compulsory.
b) At all ECAHO affiliated shows drug testing will be carried out at the discretion of the DC or the judges.
Any horse at any show may be tested at the discretion of the DC or judges.
4. The samples must be taken according to FEI Veterinary regulations. Only FEI testing veterinarians may collect the samples and they may not act in any other capacity at a show in which they have been appointed testing veterinarian.
5. Drug testing kits, analyses and honoraria of veterinarians will be paid by the show organizer or by the National Registry/Association.
6. The organiser will provide a clean box with fresh straw for each horse to be tested. These boxes will be marked as sampling boxes and will be used exclusively for this purpose. They should be located in a quiet environment with no public access.
7. Any exhibit for which the veterinarian, duly appointed to collect such specimens of blood, urine or other substances, certifies that in his opinion such collection may endanger the exhibit concerned or the persons handling such exhibit, will inform the DC's who will disqualify the horse and forward the case to the SDC. Any horse so disqualified will not receive any prize or title and will not compete further at the show concerned.
8. Horses withdrawn from such test by their owner or person responsible (i.e. the person who signed the entry form) will not receive any prize or title, will not compete further at the show concerned and will be treated as if positive. The case will be forwarded to the SDC.
9. The authorized laboratory will send the results of the tests to the show organizers or National Registry/Association who will forward them immediately to the Executive Secretary of ECAHO(show section).
10. All drug-related offences will be dealt with by the Standing Disciplinary Committee (SDC)
11. In the event that an exhibit is tested positive, the person who signed the entry form will be held fully responsible for the horse unless such person can provide full and proper evidence implicating some other person.
12. When a notification is received that a horse tested has been found positive for forbidden substances as listed in the FEI Veterinary Regulations, the Executive Secretary (show section) will inform the SDC of all the details of the chemical tests, horses and show concerned and will ask the show organiser for copies of the entry forms to be sent to the SDC. The SDC will consider all evidence available.
13. When a horse has been tested positive for forbidden substances as listed in the FEI Regulations, the exhibitor will be informed and be offered the option of a second test in the conditions set by FEI regulations. A reply will be requested to be made within 30 days after receipt of the information. With the reply, the exhibitor may request a hearing at which the SDC will meet and the exhibitor or his representative may be heard. Such hearing may be held not less than 42 days after the request for the exhibitor's reply.
14. Horses in whose body fluids a forbidden substance is discovered are automatically disqualified, after a second test has also been found positive should such test be requested.
15. The person responsible for the horse that was tested positive for forbidden substances will be liable for all costs of drug testing and subsequent costs of investigation and legal proceedings arising out of it; this person may be given a fine and /or a suspension.
16. Decisions will be made public at the conclusion of the proceedings.
